What is the NRO-NC?

- NRO = Numbers Resource Organisation

 coordination between RIRs
- NRO-NC = NRO Number Council
 - Members are appointed/elected by the RIRs

What is the ASO-AC?

- ASO = Address Supporting Organisation

 One of the ICANN "Supporting
 Organisations"
- ASO-AC = ASO Address Council
- Advises ICANN on number resource policy issues

NRO-NC = ASO-AC

- In terms of an MoU between ICANN and the NRO, the NRO-NC fulfils the role, responsibility, and functions of the ASO-AC

- Effectively, members are elected/appointed to the NRO-NC, but also serve as the ASO-AC

Membership



- 15 Members: 3 from each RIR
 - 2 elected by the community in the region
 - 1 appointed by the RIR Board
- AfriNIC representatives serve staggered three-year terms
 - Other RIRs may have other arrangements
- Observers from RIR staff and ICANN

Tasks of the ASO-AC

- Appoint seats 9 and 10 to ICANN Board of Directors
 - staggered three-year terms
- Appoint one member to ICANN NomCom

 one-year terms
- Process "Global Policy Proposals"
 per formal definition and process
- Advise ICANN Board on matters relating to number resources

Previous Appointment to ICANN NomCom



- Hartmut Glaser
 - Latin America
 - appointed to ICANN 2009 Nominating Committee



Previous Appointments to the ICANN Board of Directors

- David Wodelet
 - North America
 - term has just ended
- Raimundo Beca
 - Latin America
 - serves from May/June 2007 to 2010

Most Recent Appointment to BoD seat 9



- Ray Plzak was elected to fill seat 9
 - just in time!
- Procedures
 - AC working within a complex framework and on a very tight schedule!
 - Exercising procedures for the 2nd time
 - Met all externally-imposed requirements
 - Started a review of procedures, to improve for 2010

BoD Selection Process in 2009



- Call for Nominations issued publicly
- Assessment of eligibility of candidates
- Collection of information from and about five eligible candidates
- Candidates invited for interviews
- Public Comment Period
- Discussions within the AC
- eVoting (as mandated by the MoU and the AC's procedures)

Global Policy for remaining IPv4 address space

- Last five IPv4 /8s in IANA pool ("N = 1")
- Passed in all regions in 2008

 AfriNIC afpol-v4gp200802 (Aug 2008)
- Formally passed from NRO-EC to ASO-AC in Dec 2008
- ASO-AC passed to ICANN BoD on 4 Feb 2009
- Public comment period
- ICANN BoD ratified the policy on 6 March 2009

Global Policy Proposal for allocation of IPv4 blocks to RIRs



- Deals with recovered IPv4 space
- Introduced in all regions between Jan and May 2009

 ASO-AC and ICANN staff tracking its progress

Important Activities in rest of 2009



- Keep tracking global policy proposals
- Address Council face-to-face meeting on 25 May 2009

– next to LACNIC Meeting in Panamá City

- Again appoint a member to ICANN's NomCom for 2010
- Initiate process to elect seat 10 on ICANN's BoD for 2010
- Review of BoD selection procedure
- AC Presence at the ICANN Meetings
