Internet Policies (1)

- Upcoming approval of the New gTLD Program
- The Board intends to complete the process for final approval of the New gTLD implementation program at a meeting of the ICANN Board on Monday, 20 June 2011 at the next ICANN public meeting
- ICANN's next public meeting will be held in Singapore, June 2011

Internet Policies (2)

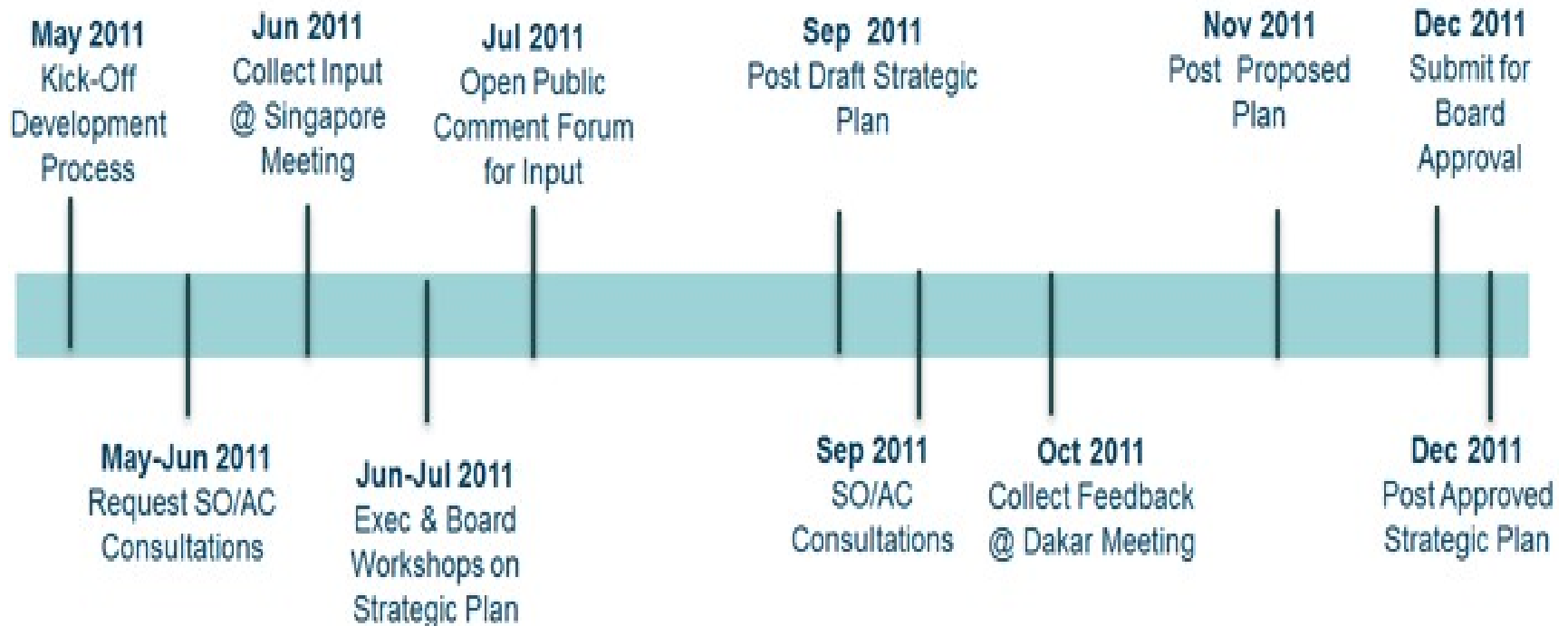
- Endorsement of all 27 recommendations made by the Accountability and Transparency Review Team
- The Board also requested ICANN staff to prepare implementation plans
- The period for accepting public comments about the process for creating new GNSO constituencies was extended

Strategic Plan

- ICANN Posted its Strategic Plan for July 2011-June 2014
- This version of the Strategic Plan includes extensive community feedback, including a 60-day Public Comment period
- As part of ICANN's planning process, the adopted Strategic Plan guides the development of the FY12 Operating Plan and Budget

Released Security, Stability and Resiliency (SSR) Plans for Comment

- The foundation of ICANN's role in security, stability and resiliency of the Internet's unique identifiers,
- Provide an overview of the Internet ecosystem and ICANN's place in it,
- Describe ICANN's operational priorities in SSR for the coming fiscal year commencing in July 2011, and
- Distinguish between ICANN's operational priorities, areas in which ICANN is a collaborator and facilitator, and areas in which ICANN is an observer or has awareness on the activities of others in the ecosystem regarding the Internet's unique identifiers

New gTLDs

- Applicant Guidebook – May 2011 is out
- Six Explanatory Memoranda on various issues identified in the Board/Governmental Advisory Committee (GAC) consultations
- Summaries and analyses of public comment on the prior Applicant Guidebook
- Most recent ICANN response to the GAC Indicative Scorecard
- Most recent GAC response to scorecard

Important note re: new gTLDs

- Numerous changes to current version
- A number of the evaluation questions have been edited to provide more detail. In most cases, the substance of the question and criteria has not changed significantly

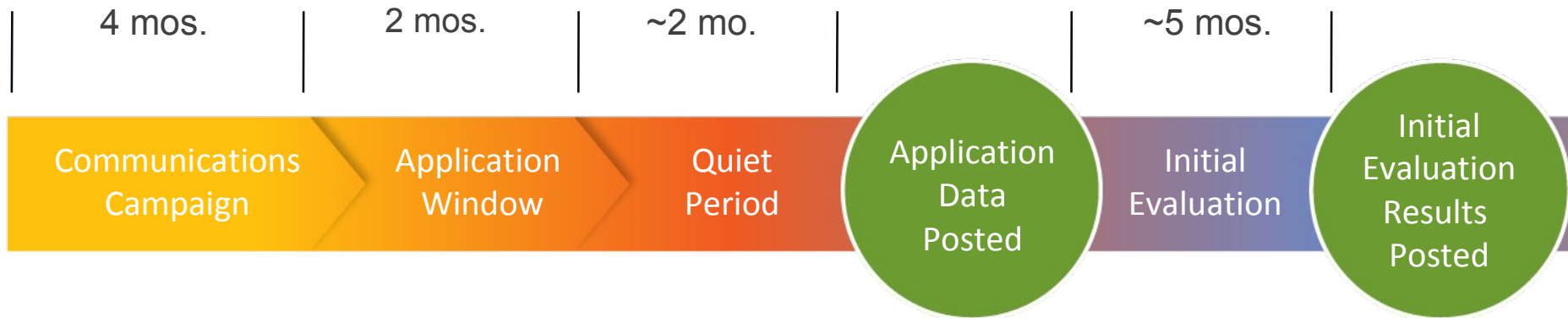
Application Window (60 days)



Important Notes:

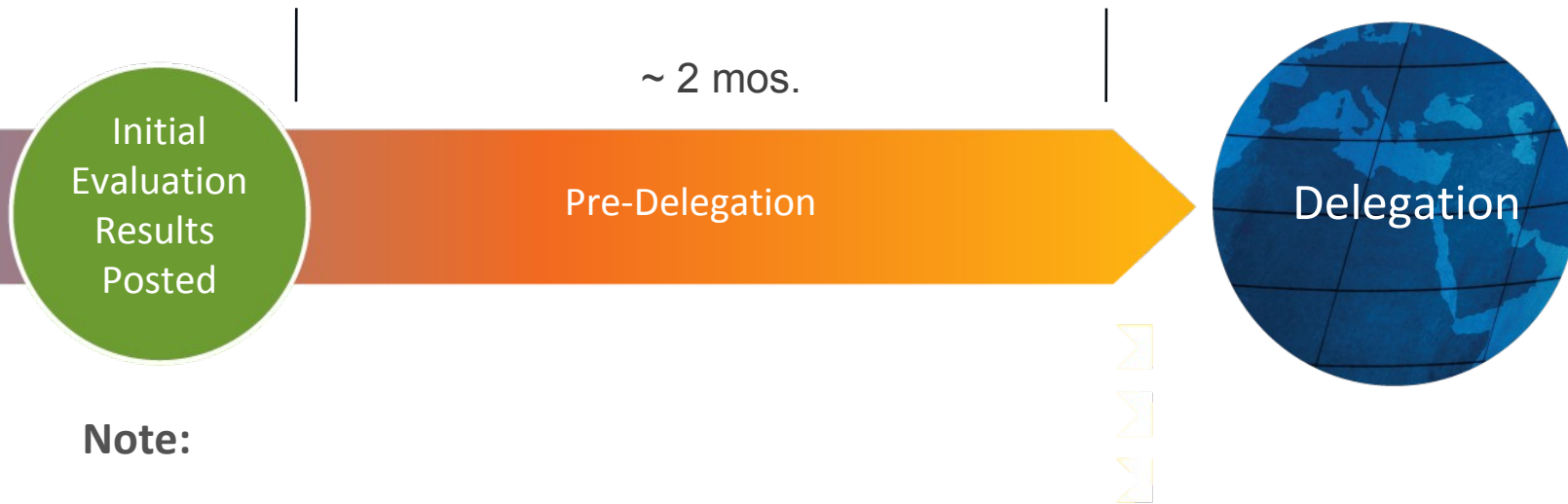
- Wire transfers and validation may take days or weeks to complete
- The remaining \$180,000 must be received by the end of the Application Window or application could be rejected

- Registry Services

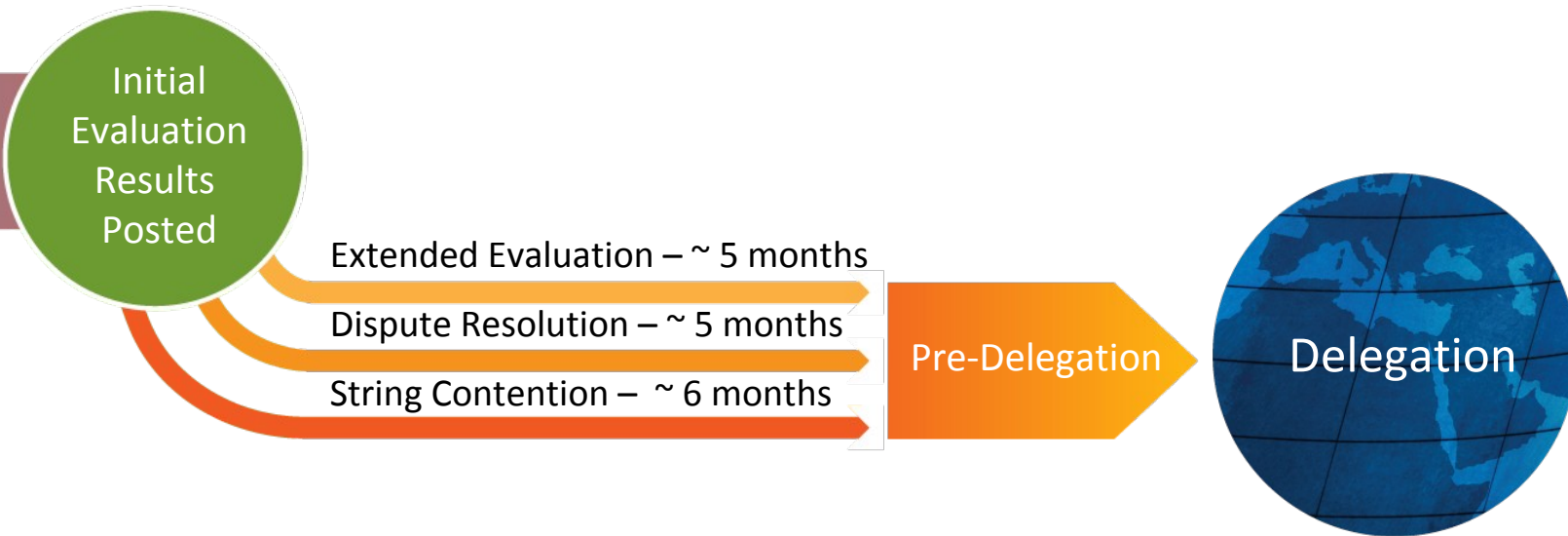
gTLD Program Timeline



Note:

- Quickest path through the Evaluation Process is approximately **9 months** after Application Window closes
- The lifecycle for a highly complex application could be much longer, such as **20 months**

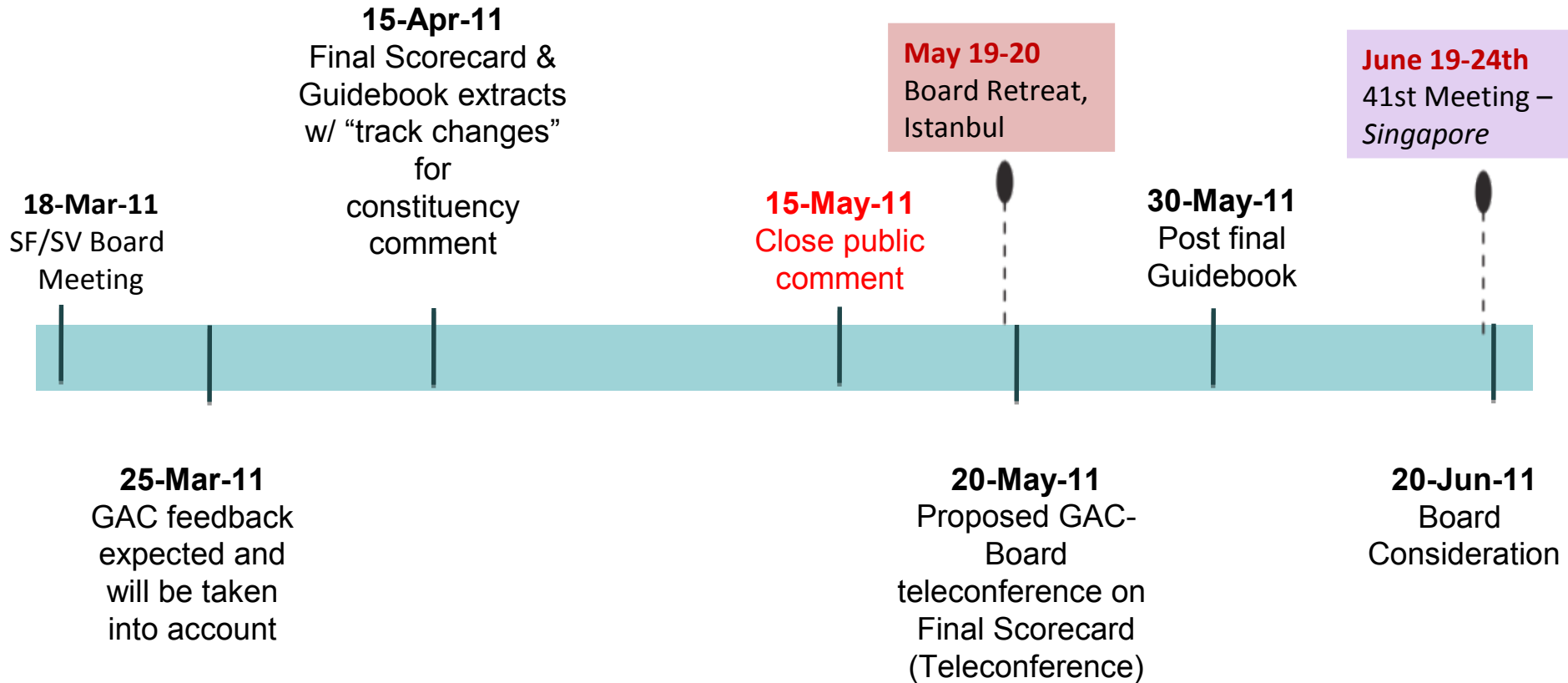

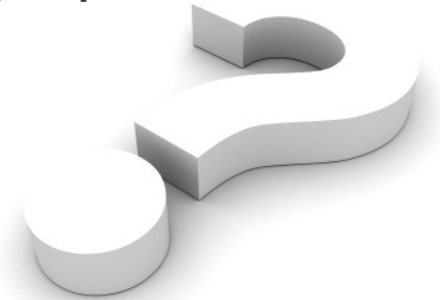

IDN variants

IDN variants: why this project?



- Long standing request from a number of IDN user communities.
- Board instructed staff to develop an issues report on the subject.

Definition of variant TLDs

- No universally accepted definition.
- In the proposal, the following* is used:
 - “Variant characters occur where a single conceptual character can be identified with two or more different Unicode Code Points with graphic representations that may or may not be visually similar. IDN variant TLDs contain one or more characters that have such variants.”

* Based on definition from RFC 3743

IDN variant TLDs as of today

- An applicant may declare variant strings for its TLD in its application.
- No variant TLD strings are delegated until variant management solutions are developed and implemented.

What is being proposed?

- Conduct up to six study cases with participants from the community:

- 1) Arabic
- 2) Chinese
- 3) Cyrillic
- 4) Devanagari
- 5) Greek
- 6) Latin

Case study composition

- Each study case composed of community members* experienced in:
 - DNS & IDNA
 - Security
 - Registry/Registrar operations
 - Policy
 - Linguistics
 - Community representatives

* Some members may be shared across case study teams

Avoid reinventing the wheel

- Survey of current TLDs' policy on IDN variants.
- Coordination with other groups working on the subject (DNSEXT, JIG, etc.)
- Use documents available from other groups as input.

Outcome (1)

1. Create a glossary of terms vetted with technical and linguistic communities.
2. Identify challenges (requirements) of IDN variant TLDs based on:
 1. linguistic accuracy,
 2. technical feasibility & accuracy,
 3. usability (including minimize user confusion),
 4. accessibility, and
 5. security and stability

Outcome (2)

- Issues Report from each case study
- Issues Report integrating common and case-specific issues
