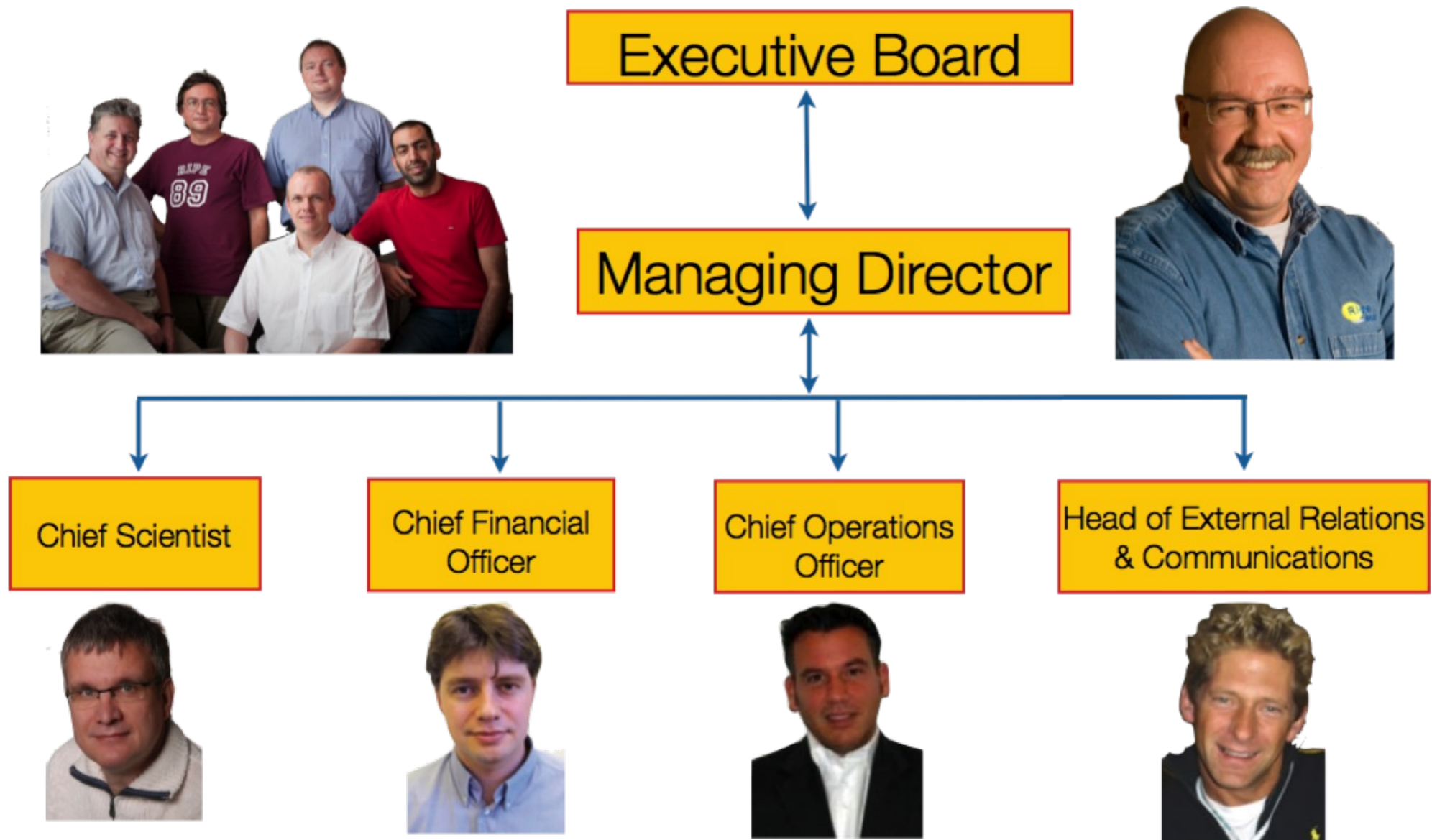

Three Strategic Pillars

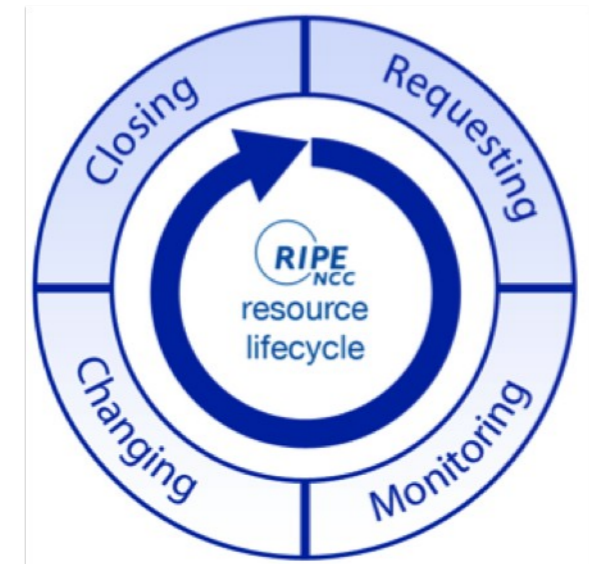
A strategic vision developed by Management team and Board

 - Engage Stakeholders in Internet Governance



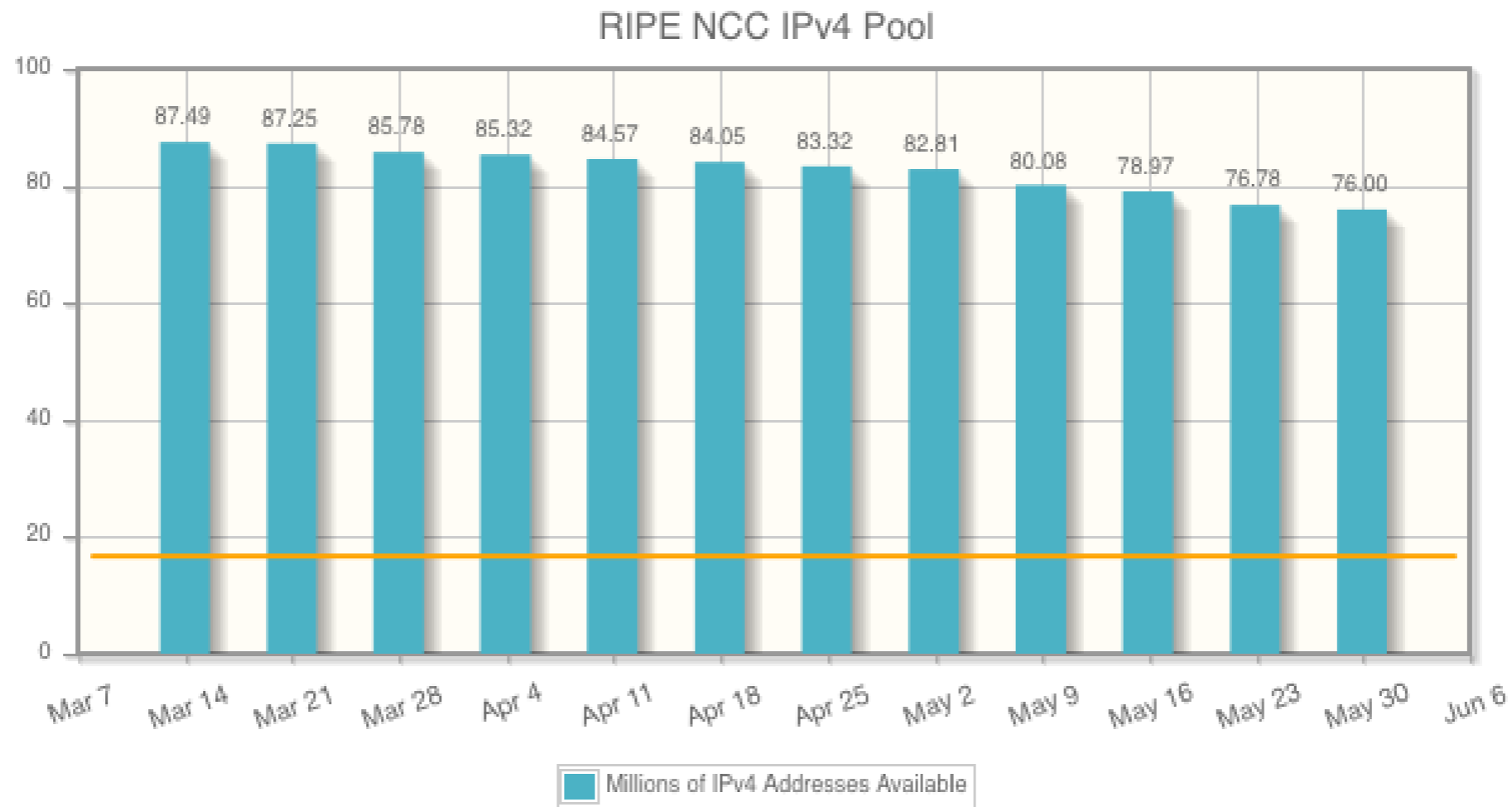
Resource Lifecycle Management (1)

- Continue allocation of resources
- Audit activities
- Reclamation
 - 957 non-paying LIRs
 - 288 LIRs re-opened
 - 666 LIRs had Allocations returned to the RIPE NCC (7,378,944 IP addresses)

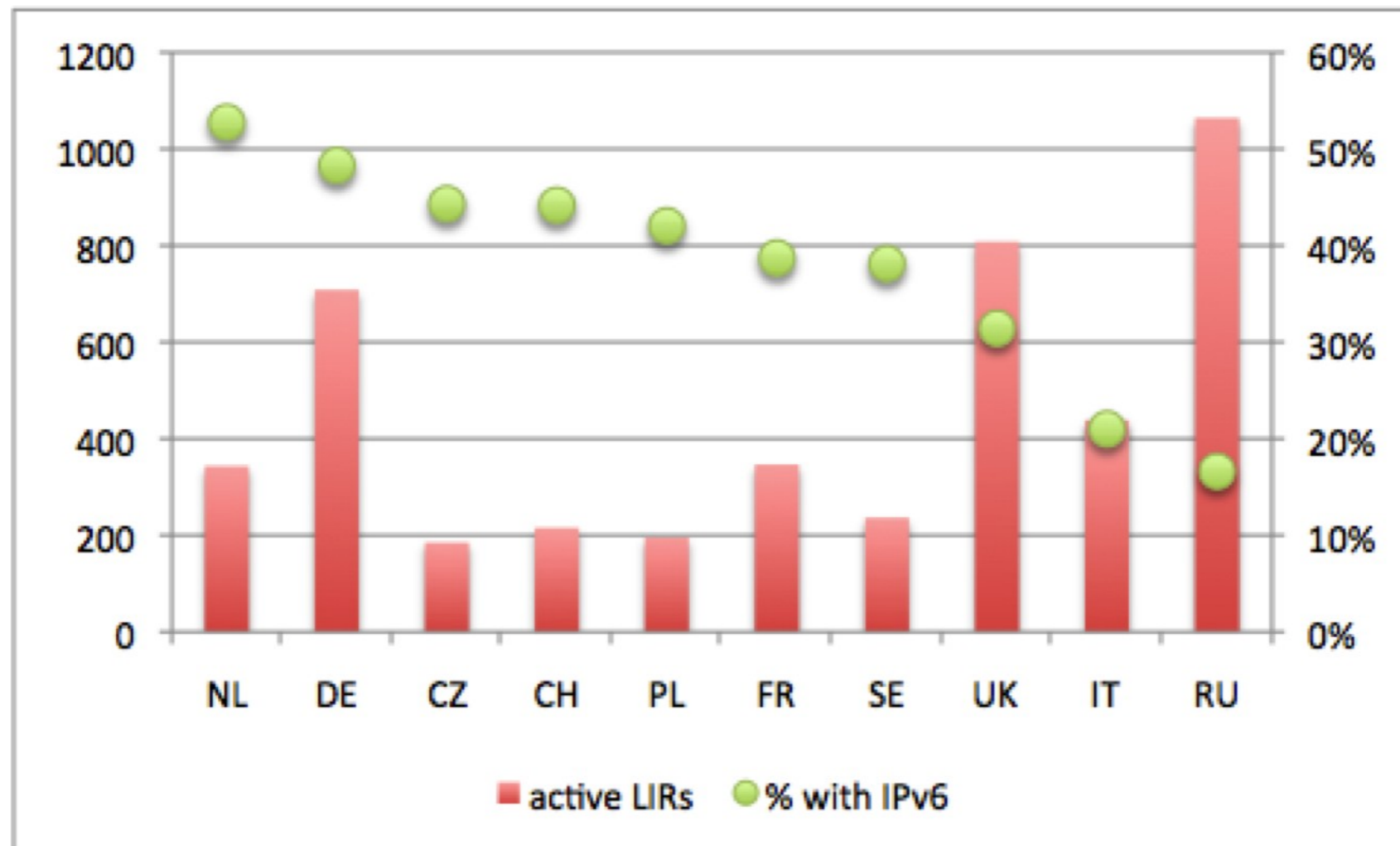


Resource Lifecycle Management (2)

Resource Lifecycle Management (4)

Resource transfer listing service (Q3 2011)

- Driver
 - Maintain an accurate and complete registry
 - Facilitate resource transfers for members
- Action
 - Provide Platform where 'lister' and 'needer' can meet
 - Member only service
 - Sponsoring LIR manages PI users resources
 - RIPE NCC confirming Legitimacy of both parties
 - Member in good standing
 - Policy based

Policy Discussions

Discussion phase:

- 2011-01: Global Policy for post exhaustion IPv4 allocation mechanisms by the IANA
- 2011-02: Removal of multihomed requirement for IPv6 PI
- 2011-03: Post-depletion IPv4 address recycling

Concluding phase:

- 2010-01: Temporary Internet Number Assignment Policies
- 2008-08: Initial Certification Policy in the RIPE NCC Service Region
