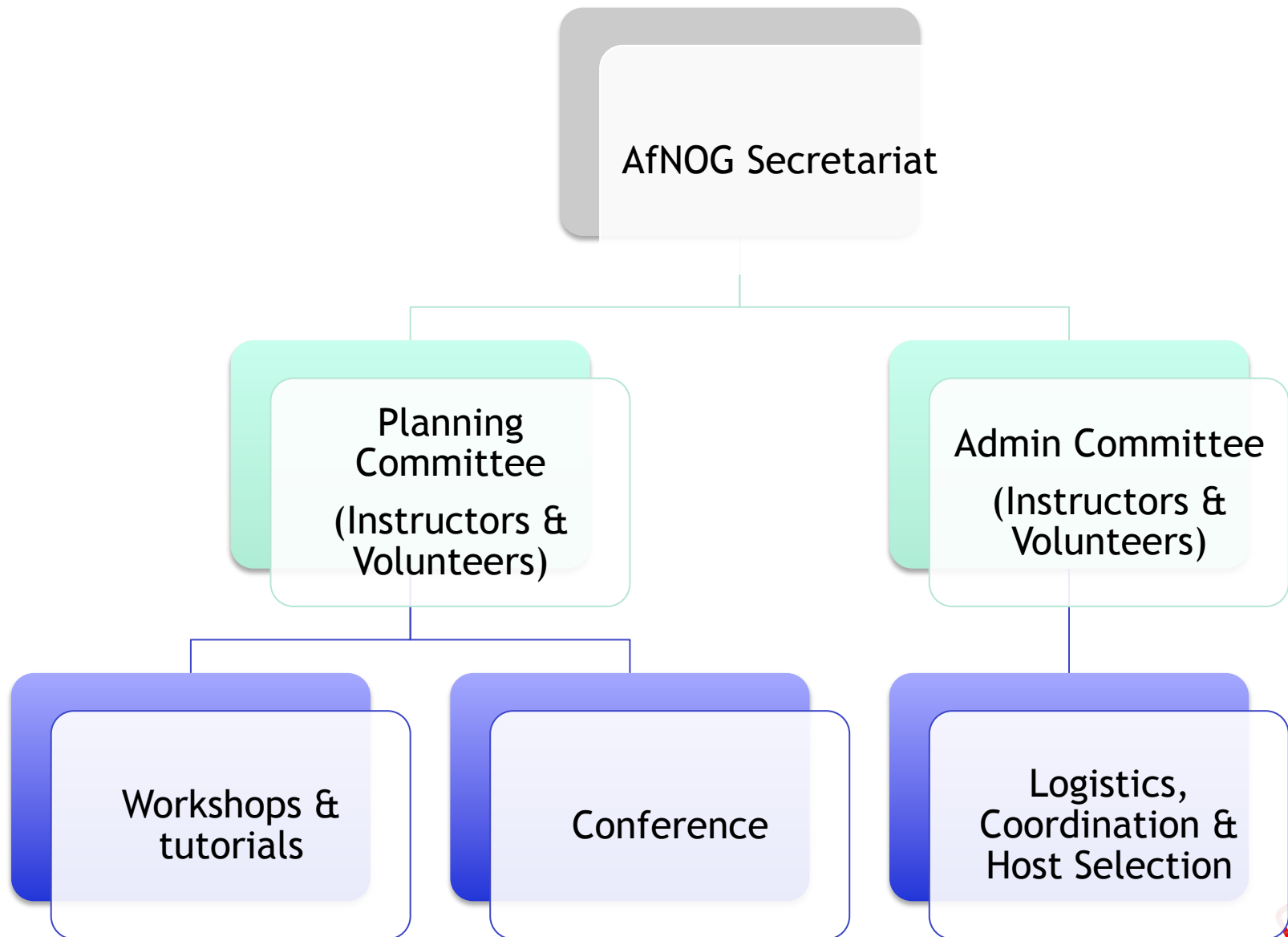


# History & Background:

- AfNOG was founded in 1999 to serve as a community of engineers helping each other to meet the technical challenges of setting up, building, and running IP Networks on the African Continent.
- AfNOG roots trace back to the Internet Society's (ISOC) annual INET/Network Training workshops held in mid to late 90's
- The conveners, instructors and supporters of AfNOG's were participants or Instructors in the ISOC INET workshops
- The inaugural workshop took place in Cape Town, South Africa in May 2000.
- Workshop was followed by one day of Regional Network Operators meeting and one day of discussions on the setup of the regional internet registry for Africa (Africa



# AfNOG Volunteer Organizational Structure



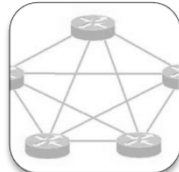

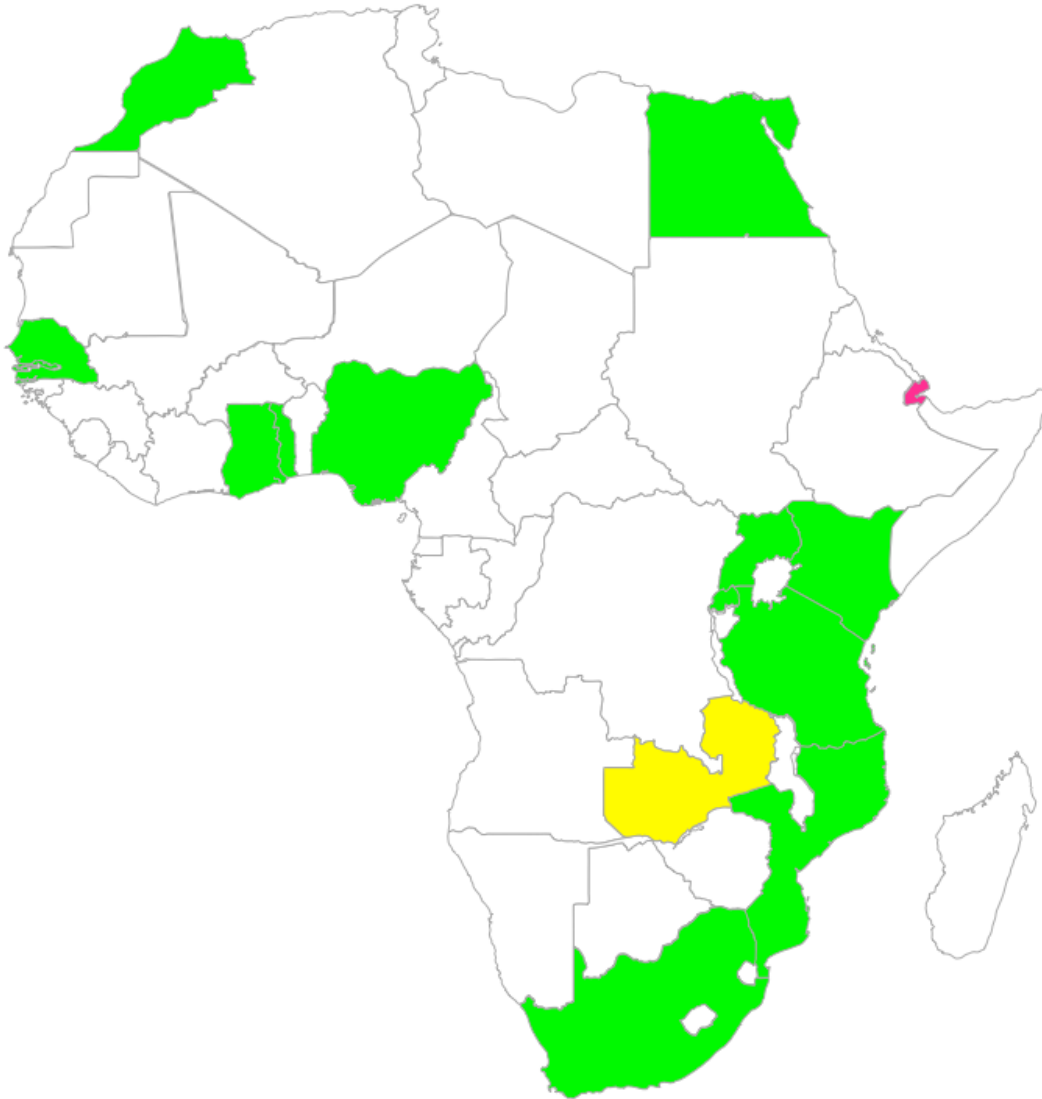

# AfNOG Accomplishments

- Over 1200 network operators from over 40 African countries have participated at AfNOG since its inception
- At inception, AfNOG held only two tracks and as at 2012 there were 6 concurrent tracks
- Developed a large pool of skilled instructors in the community.
- AfNOG has an active free and open community mailing-list that provides technical advice and guidance to those subscribed
- AfNOG has received a growing list of both local, regional and global sponsors for its activities



# Getting to AfNOG

## ■ Pre-requisites

- Have the technical background on systems administration or Internet routing
- Have attended previous AfNOG training such as AfNOG localization or main AfNOG event
- For conference speakers proposed presentation in technical area of interest

## ■ Application process

- Application for AfNOG workshops are opened between October - January
- Call for papers to present at the conference are opened between January - March

## ■ Selection Process

- Selection of both participants and presentations are done by the planning committee made up of instructors and community volunteers



# Hosting AfNOG in your Country

## ■ Call for Hosting Proposals

- The call for proposal to host AfNOG is issued between July - September of each year
- Call for proposal is currently open for 2015 - 2017

## ■ What is expected

- Proposal from local community with demonstrable support from all stakeholders including Government
- Availability of local facilities to suitably hold multiple parallel technical training workshops and conferences
